Warmer

- Play a game of hangman with the words performing arts.
- Ask students what the performing arts include and write on the board: Dance, Music and Theatre.
- Students think of three words they associate with each of the arts. Write these on the board under the headings.

- Students write the words related to dance, theatre and music, and the words related to all three
- Play the CD to check answers. Check students understand conductor, which may have a different meaning in their language.
- Play the CD again. Students repeat the words.
 Focus on word stress.
